

Job description SEN Teacher

At the ISH, SEN teachers work to identify individual needs and be responsible for creating a safe, stimulating and supportive learning environment that enables a child to succeed in their learning. At the school we currently cater for modest to mild cases of special educational needs like dyslexia or ADHD.

The position involves but is not limited to:

- teaching either individuals or small groups of students within or outside the class;
- preparing lessons and resources;
- in a few situations, marking and assessing work; developing and adapting conventional teaching methods to meet the individual needs of students;
- collaborating with the classroom teacher to define appropriate activities for the students in relation to the curriculum;
- assessing students who have long or short-term learning difficulties and working with colleagues to identify individual students' special needs; screening of new students
- liaising with the school counsellor, other professionals, such as social workers, speech and language therapists, physiotherapists and educational psychologists;
- liaising closely with teachers, parents and guardians;
- administration, including updating and maintaining records on students' progress;
- assisting teachers with behaviour management.
- Identify and teach study skills that will develop students' ability to work independently;
- All other duties as specified in the CAO (labour agreement) and the staff guide.

Experience in an IB MYP and/or IB DP environment is desirable, as is experience with testing (Bangor dyslexia screening test, non-verbal reasoning like Raven, WISC III or IV or similar). A network of outside professionals is available to refer students for which we cannot cater.
