Code of Conduct

The International School of The Hague is committed to each student's success in learning within a caring, responsive, and safe environment that is free of discrimination, violence, and bullying (including cyber-bullying). Students at the ISH are expected to maintain appropriate standards of behavior. They show respect for the school community and for visitors, therefore we ask every student to sign this Code of Conduct (Secondary School Guide) to assure that she/he is aware of her/his rights, responsibilities and possible consequences out of misbehavior.

- a. Smoking by students is not allowed anywhere inside or close to the school premises. The no-smoking rule applies also on all school trips and at functions elsewhere organized by the school.
- b. Alcohol may not be brought onto the school premises by any student at any time. Alcohol will not be available at school parties on school premises and the possession and/or consumption is strictly forbidden on all school trips and at functions elsewhere organized by the school.
- c. It is strictly forbidden to introduce or use illegal drugs anywhere on the school premises. This rule also applies during all school activities, such as school parties or school trips, which take place elsewhere. Violations of this rule will lead to immediate suspension and possible expulsion from the school.
- d. The use of tobacco, alcohol or drugs on school trips may, as an ultimate consequence, lead to an immediate return home, at parents/guardians' expense. Violating this rule will be taken most seriously and dealt with accordingly. Punishment may include expulsion from the school.
- e. The possession and/or use of knives, firearms or other dangerous objects, as well as any replicas of these objects are strictly forbidden.
- f. Taking property without the owner's consent is theft. Stealing will be taken most seriously and dealt with accordingly. Punishment may include expulsion from the school.
- g. Every ISH student is entitled to a learning environment free of discrimination, violence and bullying (including cyber-bullying). Therefore any instances of discrimination, violence and (cyber-) bullying against members of the school community will be taken most seriously and dealt with accordingly.

As a student I understand that it is a privilege to represent ISH as a student and I agree to do so in the best manner possible. I will behave in a way that reflects well on my school community.

As a parent/guardian I will support my child in behaving according to the school's policies and guidelines on behavior and equal opportunities.
